## *Quo Vadis Days/Sequela Christi Days*

### Code of Behavior and Hospitality Guidelines

The Seton/Neumann Center is a facility of the Diocese of Bridgeport. We are guests. You will be sharing your space with the other campers and the priests and seminarians (Quo Vadis Camp) or Sisters (Sequela Christi Camp) who have graciously volunteered their time to provide you with this experience. This sharing of space is quite similar to that which takes place in a family home. For this to work, each of us must be considerate of other people in the facility for space, privacy and a peaceful atmosphere.

Please review the following expectations:

1. **Any vandalism or stealing will result in immediate dismissal; financial restitution is the responsibility of the camper and his/her parents.**
2. **Alcohol, drugs or drug paraphernalia are not permitted and will result in immediate dismissal.**
3. **Weapons or simulated weapons of any kind are not permitted. This includes but is not limited to: firearms of any kind, airflow guns, BB guns, knives, etc. This may result in immediate dismissal.**
4. **All electronic devices should be left at home. This includes but is not limited to: cell phones, walkman, MP3 players, ipods, personal cd/dvd players, laser pointers.** If you are found with any of these items, they will be collected and returned to you at the conclusion of the camp. The Seton/Neumann Center is equipped with a phone for *emergency purposes*. The number is 203-748-1187. Adult leaders have cell phones should there be a need to reach your parents or your parents to reach to you.
5. **Please do not bring anything of exceptional value.**
6. The kitchen is not a “hang-out” space. With the exception of mealtimes no one (except staff) is permitted in the kitchen area. Drinks and snacks will be provided outside or in the recreation room.
7. Please do not bring food to your room. **At no time is food or drink allowed in the Chapel.**
8. **The Chapel is a place of reverence and prayer. Please remember to act accordingly when you are in the presence of Christ.**
9. Do not leave trash around the building and grounds.
10. Stay with the group and do not roam around the building or grounds. You will have recreational time permitted in designated areas.
11. Participants are expected, health permitting, to attend all activities.
12. Everyone will be assigned to a dorm room. Do not switch rooms. No visiting is allowed in dorm rooms.
13. Treat each other with respect. Be Christ to each other.

We respectfully ask for your cooperation and are sure that you will adhere to this simple code of behavior. You represent the Church and are called to project an image of Christian consideration, sensitivity and respect to all others and to the property around you.

Your parent’s/legal guardian’s signature on the front of this form means that you (the camper) understand and agree to the Camp Code of Behavior and realize that infractions may result in your dismissal.
